Course Description

This is a 4-week special Advanced Italian course offered as part of the Summer Intensive Italian Language & Culture Program. Students with five or more semesters of college Italian language instruction might test into the second module of the C1 Upper Advanced level (based on the Common European Framework for Languages – CEFR) and receive a total of four credits for their studies in Italian advanced Italian Grammar, Syntax, and Conversation. Traditional in-class language instruction conducted at the *Università per Stranieri* is supplemented by a rich series of cultural co-curricular activities by faculty at the Umbra Institute.

This is a particular course in Advanced Grammar, Syntax and Conversation that is usually not offered in standard undergraduate Italian Language programs in the United States, but perfect for students preparing to become teachers of Italian or wanting to undertake graduate studies in the humanities. It is designed to take students from being competent speakers of the target language to explaining to them the nuances and subtleties of the language that make the difference between a very good user and a near-native speaker. Students in this level will delve deeper into the intricacies of syntax, learn more grammatical exceptions, and be exposed to more idiomatic expressions. Students at this level will become able to use the language not only socially, but also professionally and academically with a certain degree of sophistication. They will also notice that they start to recognize not only implicit but also explicit meaning in longer and more demanding written and verbal texts.

Students can take **one optional** elective course on cultural topics*, choosing between the following options:

- Letteratura italiana (Italian literature)
- Storia dell'arte italiana (History of Italian Art)
- Storia dell'arte italiana - lezioni fuori sede (History of Italian Art – taught on site)
- Storia del teatro italiano (History of Italian Theater)
- Storia del cinema italiano (History of Italian Cinema)
- Storia della musica italiana (History of Italian Music)
- Arte della parola. Dizione e lettura espressiva (The Art of the Spoken Word: Diction and Expressive Reading Laboratory)

Students who take this course will be awarded 6 credits at the end of the semester.

*Please note: Not all courses might be available during the semester

Course Objectives and Learning Outcomes

The C1 level, the course is designed to take students from being competent speakers of the target language to explaining to them the nuances and subtleties of the language that make the difference between a very good user and a near-native speaker. Activities at the Umbra Institute

In addition to their private and group tutoring sessions, students enrolled in the Summer Intensive Italian Language & Culture Program will have access to a vast series of cultural activities designed to improve their language speaking skills in a natural environment while introducing them to practices of daily life and the cultural offerings of Central Italy. These activities include the following:

- Traditional welcome dinner;
- Tandem nights with Italian university students;
- Day-Trip to Tuscany
- “Serate in cucina”- cooking with faculty members or local experts;

- Trips to local festivals (e.g., typical Central Italian “sagre”, Perugia 1416, Umbria Jazz);
- Guided tours of Perugia and other Umbrian towns;
- Visit to local winery with tastings;
- Live Concert performances
- Farewell Festa

A final co-curricular activities series schedule will be provided during orientation.
